#### **4. EXTERNAL EXAMINATIONS AND COMPETITIVE ASSESSMENTS**

During the academic session, AECS-3 actively encouraged students to participate in a wide range of external examinations aimed at broadening academic exposure and strengthening competitive skills. Here follows the list of examinations, quizzes and competitive assessments that we conducted this year

1. **Green Olympiad (TERI):** The Green Olympiad was conducted in November 2025, and a total of 105 students participated in the examination.
2. **National Financial Literacy Assessment Test (NFLAT):** The NFLAT, organised by NCFE for Classes VI–XII, saw active participation from our students. Samruddhi Ganesh Mane (7B) earned a Certificate of Merit for her commendable performance.
3. **INSPIRE MANAK Awards:** Under the INSPIRE MANAK scheme, the school nominated innovative project ideas from five students—Dhyan L. Narayan (7A), Hridaya Grover (7B), Mrunali Jadhav (9A), Jandhyala Sai Sricharan (9A) and Devika Krishna (7B).
4. **Indian Olympiad Qualifier in Mathematics (IOQM):** The IOQM examination was conducted on 7 September 2025 for Classes VIII–X, with 15 students participating from the school.
5. **Vidyaarthi Vigyaan Manthan (VVM):** A total of 61 students appeared for the Level 1 exam of VVM, out of which 23 students successfully qualified for Level 2.
6. **National Standard Examination in Junior Science (NSEJS – IAPT):** The NSEJS examination was conducted on 23 November 2025 for students of Classes VIII–X, and 12 students participated from the school.
7. **WWF India Quiz:** The WWF India Quiz was held in August 2025 with 75 participants from Classes VI–X. Arya Jha (7A) and Abhidev Manojkumar (6A) qualified for the city-level round, showcasing their strong environmental awareness.
8. **Aryabhata Ganit Challenge (CBSE):** The Aryabhata Ganit Challenge was conducted on 10 October 2025 with 75 students participating from Classes VIII–X. Shreyansh Singh (8A), Atharva Dwivedi (8C) and Hariharasudhan M. Konar (9A) qualified for Stage 2, which was held on 10 November 2025.
9. **National Mathematics Talent Contest (NMTC – AMTI):** In the NMTC examination, 69 students appeared for Level 1 and 11 students advanced to Level 2. Selected students included Gopika Madhavraj Bhatt (5B), Anwesh Bhattacharya (6B), Harshad Vithoba Chandekar (6A) and Vishal Bhagwan Sanap (6A).
10. **IWSA Ganit Pratiyogita:** The competition was conducted for Classes VI to VIII, with a total of 42 students participating.
11. **Standard Examination in High School Science (IAPT):** This examination was conducted for Classes VII to X and saw the participation of 6 students.

12. **Brihan Mumbai Ganit Adhyapak Mandal Maths Quiz:** The quiz was held on 14 September 2025 and 8 students from Classes VI to IX took part in the event.

13. **M. R. Pai Elocution Competition:** The school successfully conducted the competition for Classes IX and X on 20 November 2025 from 12:00 pm to 1:30 pm. A total of 12 students participated, and the event aimed to enhance public speaking abilities and confidence.

14. **CBSE Reading Challenge:** The challenge was conducted in both Hindi and English in October 2025. A total of 82 students participated in Round 1, and 10 students qualified for Round 2.

15. **CBSE Storytelling Competition:** Conducted on 3 November 2025, the competition saw the enthusiastic participation of 53 students at the school level, showcasing their creativity and storytelling skills.

16. **Brain Boost Bonanza & Axiom Adventure – IIT Bombay Campus School Golden Jubilee:** As part of the Golden Jubilee celebrations, students participated in both competitions under the guidance of Ms. Mudita and Ms. Sita Lakshmi.

1. Master Hadi Abdul Salam and Master Darshil Kamble secured the Second Runner-up position in “Create Your Own Experiment” (Classes III–V).
2. Miss Avani Gupta and Miss Samriddhi Mane secured the First Position in the same event for Classes VI–VIII.
3. Master Akarsh Jha and Master Ayush Chachan secured the Second Runner-up position in the Axiom Adventure (Science and Mathematics Quiz).

17. **Bhartiya Sanskriti Gyan Pariksha:** Conducted on 7 November 2025, the examination saw 72 students participate, enabling them to deepen their understanding of India's cultural heritage.

18. **IIT Bombay Techfest Olympiad:** Coordinated by Ms. Sarita Kumari, the examination was conducted on 10 November 2025 with 265 students successfully completing Level 1, demonstrating strong interest in science and technology.

19. **SBI Scholar Quiz:** Four students participated in this competition in June 2025.

20. **Inter-AECS Quiz by Anu Nari Shakti:** Eight students competed in June 2025, with the winning team representing the school at the Inter-AECS level.

21. **THINQ National Quiz – Indian Navy:** Twenty students participated in this prestigious national-level quiz in September 2025.

22. **CBSE Heritage Quiz:** One team of three students represented the school in the online event held in November 2025.

23. **Nehru Science Centre Quiz, Parel:** Two teams comprising four students each participated in November 2025. Advaith Menon and Aayushi Ojha of Class IX qualified for the second round.

24. **Indian Oil Quiz:** Two students from Class IX represented the school in the competition held in December 2025.

25. **4th State-Plasma Exhibition Quiz Competition:** Conducted by the Institute of Plasma Research on 8 October 2025, Advaith Menon (Class IX) and Swaminath S. Nair (Class X) secured the Second Prize.

26. **Veer Gatha 5.0:** Under the theme “My Role Model – Gallantry Award Winners,” the school organised painting (Classes IV–V), poem-writing (Classes VI–VIII), and essay-writing competitions (Classes IX–X). Nearly 150 students participated, showcasing patriotism, creativity, and respect for India’s brave heroes.
27. **CBSE Science Challenge 2025–26:** The online quiz was conducted at AECS-2 for Classes VIII, IX, and X. Two students, Nishant M. Bandiwdekar (X A) and Swaminath Nair (X A), represented the school in the school-level round.
28. **Viksit Bharat Buildathon 2025–26:** Six teams from AECS-3 submitted innovative ideas aligned with the themes of Vocal for Local, Atmanirbhar Bharat, Swadeshi, and Samriddh Bharat for district, state, and national evaluation.
29. **Future Tech Olympiad (FTO) 2025:** Organised by CBSE in collaboration with IBM, the Olympiad focused on emerging technologies including AI, Data Science, Cybersecurity, and AR/VR. A total of 57 students from Classes VII to X participated, and results are awaited.
30. **Model United Nations (MUN) – Maharashtra 2025:** Held on 5 and 6 December at A.C. Patil College of Engineering, the event saw students representing Egypt, France, and Finland. Participants engaged in committee sessions (UNHRC and UNGA) discussing cybersecurity, misinformation, and human rights. AECS-3 delegates were recognised for Best Delegate and Best Speaker awards.
31. **Monthly MCQs:** The school regularly evaluates students' academic progress by conducting OMR-based MCQ tests at the end of each month across all classes.

## **5. EXHIBITIONS**

### **Rashtriya Bal Vaigyanik Pradarshani (11 July, 2025)**

The school-level Rashtriya Bal Vaigyanik Pradarshani was conducted on 11 July 2025 at AECS-3, Mumbai, on the theme “STEM for Vikshit and Atmanirbhar Bharat.” A total of 157 exhibits were presented—83 from the Secondary Section and \*\*74 from the Primary Section—with participation from over 350 students.

Seven first-position winners qualified to represent the school at the Inter-AECS Exhibition – Rashtriya Bal Vaigyanik Pradarshani, held at AECS-6 from 5 to 7

December 2025. Our students showcased innovative ideas with enthusiasm and dedication, gaining valuable learning and experience through the process. We commend all the young participants for their creativity, hard work, and exemplary teamwork.

### **Plasma Exhibition (6–11 October 2025)**

The Institute of Plasma Research, Gandhinagar, in collaboration with AEC Schools, organised an enriching Plasma Exhibition at the DAE Convention Centre. The event successfully brought together innovators, researchers, teachers, and young learners to explore the cutting-edge world of plasma technology. Through insightful demonstrations, interactive models, and engaging discussions, the exhibition played a vital role in raising scientific awareness, fostering curiosity, and highlighting real-world applications of plasma in various fields.

## **6. INVESTITURE CEREMONY**

Out of all the participants, over 250 students emerged as winners, earning accolades for their extraordinary performances and earning points for their houses.

The events conducted this year catered to a wide range of interests and talents, ensuring that every student had an opportunity to shine.

Poster making, greeting card design, wall hanging making, key chain making, magazine cover designing, and Indian Art rangoli competitions brought out the creative flair of our participants. Singing and dance competitions set the stage alive, with students performing with grace and energy. The elocution and recitation events revealed the eloquence and expressive skills of our young orators.

Debates encouraged critical thinking and persuasive skills, while the quiz was an intellectual treat, testing not just knowledge of the world but also teamwork and strategy.
